THE END THAT EATS

Writer, director and co-producer. This feature length project is currently in pre-production. It is a film noir/mystery/thriller about Hal Parks, a film historian and biographer who is researching the late director David Camden Rhodes. When one of Hal's primary sources of information is murdered a trail of clues leads to Mr. Rhodes's moldering estate in Mexico and his widow, the once famous and still alluring Mary O'Connor. A sometimes comic tale of Hal's myopic quest for the fabled missing reels of Rhodes's last (and unfinished) film, *THE END THAT EATS* packs a cinematic wallop along with insights into fame, obsession and corruption.

TANK 47

Writer, director, editor and co-cinematographer, *TANK 47* is a short subject that follows two stranded astronauts as they struggle to find a way back home. Along the way they consider luck, fate and elevator related deaths. Examining the capricious nature of life through scenes both comic and surreal, *TANK 47* reveals a cosmic reality reminiscent of those found in *THE FAR SIDE* and *NEW YORKER* cartoons.
